## Performing Arts – Music Composition: Folk/Gospel/Jazz/Pop

Charles L. (Charley) Sandage of Mountain View is a singer/songwriter, performer, recording artist, music producer and educator. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Engineering degree in social studies education from Henderson State University in Arkadelphia, a Master of Arts degree in speech from the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville and a Doctor of Education degree in college administration from the UA. Sandage was the first program director at the Ozark Folk Center in Mountain View and he performs his music at the Center today. Now retired, he writes songs and produces CDs as part of the Arkansas Stories project, which features original and traditional music. She attended the American Musical and Dramatic Academy in New York City, where she earned an Associate Degree in musical theater. She is an honorary inductee into the international "Divas Blues Project." Brick has toured internationally and has released three albums since 2009. She is a supporter and participant in the "Blues in The Schools" program. She is also a member of the Arkansas Arts Council's Arts on Tour Artist Roster.
